Govt. responsibility and unity among students, faculty, and staff. Together, we strive to make a positive impact on the environment and inspire others to join our mission.




D) Committee Against Sexual Harassment (CASH) / Grievance Redressal Cell

RULES AND REGULATIONS (Discipline)

College Rules and Regulations

- 1. Every student is bound to adhere the regularity, punctuality and discipline during working hours in the Campus.
- 2. All students are required to possess their I-card in the College, issued soon after admission.
- 3. All the male students shall be in College uniform i.e., white shirt, black pant and black shoes. In winters, they should add black sweater/Jacket/ Blazer.
- 4. Female students are directed to be in the College uniform i.e., white Salwar Suit and Dupatta. In winters, they should add black sweater/ Jacket/ Blazer. However, Pink dupatta / Pink Salwar Suit is allowed to married female students.
- 5. Use of cellphone is strictly prohibited in and around Classrooms for other than teaching learning process.

- 6. Use of tobacco, chewing gum and polythene bags are injurious to health and environment.
- 7. Students shall park their vehicles in proper way in the parking area.
- 8. No relatives or strangers shall be allowed to see the student during the College working hours without prior permission from the Head of the Institute.
- 9. Any student who indulges in any kind of indiscipline in the College shall not be eligible for any prizes, certificates, awards, scholarships etc.
- 10. The Principal shall be competent to cancel admission of a student enrolled for a programme of study if he/she remains absent continuously for a period of 20 days without permission of the Principal concerned.
- 11. RAGGING in terms of words spoken, or by written, or by teasing, passing comments, ill treatment with students of weaker section of the society or atrocities against women shall be strictly observed and dealt with in the campus.
- 12. To deal with this menace, an Anti-Ragging squad has been constituted and shall keep on toes in the campus and who so ever found indulged in such activities will be punished, even to the extent of being expelled from the college.
